Advisory Theme of the Month:

Our advisory focus for January is '**Back to Basics.**' Throughout the month, we will revisit our core VIKES expectations across all areas of the building. In addition to reinforcing positive behavior, students will engage in dynamic classroom lessons designed to strengthen their peer conflict resolution skills.

6th Grade News:

Science - We are finishing up our study of Biology. We will review this week, then have a quiz over the body systems research we have been doing. The Unit Test will be the week of 1/19. Our next unit will be The Universe!

Geography - In sixth grade, Geography students are completing their study of Government. Our next unit of study will focus on North America, Canada, and Mexico. The students will "zoom" in on each country and study their landscape, location, and culture. We will then compare the cultures to the others we have studied so far this school year. Please look for an assessment in early February!

Math - We started unit 4 Dividing Fractions. We also completed the mid-year math NWEA testing.

English- The Compare and Contrast Essay that compares the Lotus Hotel scene in the Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief novel and movie has been completed and is in the process of being graded. 6th-grade English students are moving into a new unit of study. We will read The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind, a narrative nonfiction book written by William Kamkwamba and Bryan Mealer. Students will learn about the design thinking process and how that process can help people solve critical problems in their communities, as William Kamkwamba did in his African village.

7th Grade News:**World History**-

Our 7th grade students are continuing to learn about Ancient Greece. We are learning about Alexander the Great and the empire during that time period. We are also learning about how the culture of Greece played a pivotal role in their time.

Science-

Mr. Huizenga's Science classes wrapped up our Energy unit by reviewing what we've learned and completing an assessment on motion, forces, and energy. Students worked hard and showed great effort. Next, we're excited to begin a new unit on waves, where students will explore different types of waves, wave interactions, and discover their unique characteristics.

Math-

Math classes are presently finishing up Unit 4, Proportional Relationships and Percentages. Students will have an assessment for Unit 4 the end of next week or the beginning of the following week. Afterwards we will begin Unit 5, Operations with Positive and Negative Numbers.

English-

The English classes jumped right back into our study of epidemics. We're finishing our study of cholera, Dr. John Snow, and the "shoe-leather" method that is still used today, and beginning our investigations of the 1906 Typhoid Outbreak on Oyster Bay (Hello, Typhoid Mary!)

Ms. Feenstra's Class:

ELA - Students will perform the Lorax readers' theater on January 15th at 9:30 in Ms. Feenstra's room and give their presentation on the new butterfly gardens.

Social Studies/Science- We have started a new solar system unit.

Math- We are working through topics connected to the solar system and math. This week, we will be working on telling time, elapsed time, and creating schedules.

Viking Express- We will be running the Hot Chocolate Express on Thursdays during the month of January to raise money for PBIS rewards. Hot Chocolate will be sold for \$2.00.

8th Grade News:

United States History- Over the next few weeks, we will finish up our unit on Westward Expansion and begin a new unit on Social Reformers. We will have a QUIZ on Friday, January 9th.

English- Miss Martin's students are finishing the novel, Summer of the Mariposas. Christensen's students are preparing to showcase their knowledge of objective summaries.

Math- The Math 8 students are working on solving linear equations. There will be a sub-unit quiz this upcoming Tuesday. We will be working our way through this unit for 2-3 more weeks.

Algebra- The algebra students are preparing for their final exam. This will take place on 1/13 and 1/14 and it will be 15% of their final semester grade. After that, we will cover Scientific Notation and then begin unit 5 on Systems of Equations.

Science-

Students are using their knowledge of fossils to help understand the Geologic Time Scale. As they take time to learn about the past, it may give us a better understanding of what we can do today to enhance our current time Epoch

Students in Ms. Tate's classes are finishing up a unit on plate tectonics, earthquakes, and volcanoes, and will then switch to Earth history
