Actor of the month: Avery Anderson and Addison Alvesteffer

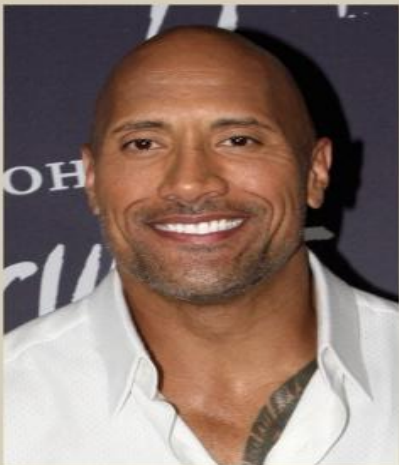
The actor that we have chosen is Dwayne The Rock Johnson.
