WMS NEWS

6th Grade News:

Science - We are continuing our study of our solar systems.

Math- In Math, we are in Unit 6: solving equations. This is your student's first time working with variables! This unit requires a lot of grit dealing with a new topic. A quiz can be expected later this week or early next week.

ELA - In English this week we have continued to read the novel The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind analyzing the design thinking process that William used as he developed his windmill to bring electricity to his village. In addition, this week we introduced the final assessment for the end of this novel study which will be a research essay. This four-paragraph essay will present a critical problem faced by an innovator and their solution to their problem. Students have been given 10 innovators to choose from, each having prescreened resources for use. They may need to work on their research notes at home as homework in order to complete the essay before we head to spring break!

Geography- Students have been learning about the settling of North and South America through Early American Civilizations. They will be exploring the history through colonies to countries.

7th Grade News:

Science: Mr. Huizenga's Science classes will complete the Waves Unit with the Electromagnetic Spectrum and take a Final Assessment over the entire Wave Sections. Next, we will completely switch gears for the remainder of the school year and study Ecology, a great excuse to get outside and enjoy the warmer weather.

ELA: The ELA classes are wrapping up our Harlem Renaissance module, which focuses on the artists, authors, musicians, and dancers of the time and the influence they have on the arts of today. The culminating activity is a Museum Project in which students will design and create a museum exhibit with works connected by a common theme from the Harlem Renaissance. The grade level museum will be on display in the VAC during the week before spring break.

8th Grade News:

On March 5th the eighth graders met with the high school counselors. They covered high school credits, schedules, elective choices and extracurricular activities available in high school. All students will be sharing the information with parents in a slide show, recording their selected classes in PowerSchool and parents will need to sign a schedule form.

ELA:

ELA classes are in the throes of changing units. 8th graders are going to be becoming immersed in the time of World War II, and more specifically, the events of the Holocaust. Students will be conducting a novel study of Maus I: A Survivor's Tale – My Father Bleeds History by Art Spiegelman as well as interacting with other texts from/about the Holocaust.

Math 8:

Math 8 students are finishing up Unit 5 this week. We are moving into a shorter unit, Unit 6 - Associations in Data next. This will be a change in material from what we have been doing recently.

Algebra:

In Algebra, students have just taken their Unit 6 test and have started to change their mindset into quadratics. This will be a fun new unit where the students will be learning a brand-new topic.

U.S. History:

This week and next we are learning about the American Civil War.

Science:

We started our water cycle unit by learning about the three limiting nutrients Nitrogen, Carbon and Phosphorus and how they cycle through our environment. Water is one of our most valuable resources, especially here in great lakes region. Students are learning how water moves through the various water sheds and systems

History: The 7th graders completed their trip on the Silk Road. They are creating a Google Slide Show on a topic from Ancient China! They will be sharing them in class next week. We will be closing out the year with two more units on Greece and Rome!

Math: Students are working on adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing positive and negative rational numbers. Students are applying their math calculation knowledge to real-world situations such as rates, account balances, and temperature changes. We will be finishing up with Unit 5 next week and having our Unit 5 Assessment. We will then get started in Unit 6, "Expressions, Equations, and Inequalities", before we go on spring break on April 4th.

Electives News:

This week's elective spotlight is on the Band program!

7th and 8th grade bands performed at MSBOA Band Festival on February 27th and received great feedback from judges to improve sound and technique. 8th grade did compete and received a Division 3 good rating. We look forward to playing at festival next year!

The Middle School Spring Band Concert is on Tuesday, May 13th at 6pm. Students have a call time of 5:15 pm at the High School band room. We will also have a Dress Rehearsal on Monday, May 12th at 6:30 pm to practice logistics for the concert the following day.

Students should arrive prior to call time on concert day wearing black pants and black shoes/socks, as well as a shirt that they can put their polo over. We are so excited to play some great music for you and hope to see you there!
