Our next meeting is scheduled for November 3, 2025 from 6:30-7:30 at the Viking Athletic Center (conference room). Please join us!

## 6th Grade News:

**Geography:** Students are exploring how humans interact with our natural environment and the value of our natural resources as we study places.

**Science**: We are now wrapping up our study of graphing and will move into Biology after the break.

**English**: Sixth-grade English students are continuing their book study of Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief. The Mid-Unit Assessment will be administered this week. We will begin analyzing themes in fiction texts next week.

**Math:** We are starting a new unit on Ratios. Students will:

- -Use tables, double number lines, and ratios per 1 to solve problems with equivalent ratios.
- -Describe ratio relationships between two quantities using appropriate notation and mathematically precise language.
- -Analyze strategies for solving problems involving equivalent ratios, including using tables and double number lines.

#### 7th Grade News:

World History: Our 7th grade students are currently learning about Ancient Egypt and how the Nile River had such an impact on life at this time. We are also learning about the Egyptian pyramids and the reasons for them. We are going to have our quiz on Mesopotamia on October 24th.

**Science:** Mr. Huizenga's Science Classes completed their first section of motion by researching jobs that use physics and presenting their slide shows to the class. Next up, Forces and Newton's Laws!

English: The 7th graders have just wrapped up their first unit of our 'Lost Children of Sudan' module. In unit two, we continue our class novel, A Long Walk to Water, and introduce other non-fiction accounts of life as a 'lost child' of Sudan before writing a comparative essay.

Math: Math students are finishing up Unit 2 on proportional relationships. They will have their unit assessment late next week and then begin Unit 3 on Measuring Circles. In this unit students will learn about Unit circles and finding the area and circumferences of circles.

## Ms. Feenstra's class:

**ELA and Science:** We are going to start our work in restoring the butterfly garden, writing grants for materials, and rehearsing our Lorax readers' theater. We are also reading and learning more about the water cycle and how we can do our part to minimize water pollution.

Math: We are finishing our work on making and interpreting bar graphs and will be moving on to solving multiplication facts.

**Social Studies:** We are learning more about current events in our community and nation, along with starting our next unit on Sacagawea.

Viking Express: The next Viking Express will be open on October 24th during all lunch periods.

## 8th Grade News:

United States History: Over the next few weeks, we will learn about the United States Constitution. We will discuss the Articles of Confederation, Bill of Rights, Preamble, and the 3 Branches of Government.

Math: The Math 8 students have taken a quiz this week on the first half of Unit 2 - Dilations, Similarity, and Slope. The class will continue to work their way through Unit 2 over the next week. There will be a unit test in approximately 5-7 days.

**Algebra:** The algebra students are in the middle of unit 2, Linear Equations and Inequalities. The assessment for this unit will be the last week of October.

The students also created a College Board account which will allow the students to receive their PSAT results.

**Science:** In the United States, we have an abundance of fresh water.....or do we? Students helped RAISE AWARENESS by creating a poster about how we can conserve water and save one of our most precious resources.

Students are also preparing to test water quality parameters on the various streams that feed into White Lake. Each science class will be responsible for testing the water quality of one tributary next week on Wednesday (Ms. Tate's classes) and Thursday (Mr. Buntley's classes).

**English:** We began a new novel, Summer of the Mariposas by Guadalupe Garcia McCall. This is a Latin American rendition of The Odyssey. They are working on writing gist statements as well as exercising their comprehension skills.

The marking period is coming to an end next week Friday – please check PowerSchool for any missing assignments!

## **Electives News:**

**Leadership:** Students are working on engaging in difficult conversations, recognizing leaders around them, and exercising self-control through various skills, tips, and tricks.

Choir: Believe it or not, we are less than two months away from our December 11th Winter Choir Concert! This week, WMS Choirs voted on some selections and started working on their winter repertoire. As weird as it feels to sing holiday and winter-themed music in October, sometimes that's the way it works in the choir world!

**Band:** The Winter Band Concert is also creeping up! Join us at 6:30 pm on December 9th at Whitehall High School for a night of festive music!
