6th Grade News:

6th Grade Field Trip Reminder: Zoo Field Trip is Thursday, June 5th. Students should ride the bus to the zoo, but if parents would like to sign out their child at the end of the day you may have your child ride home with you. Please sign out with your child’s first hour teacher.

Geography: Students are reviewing the Geography of the Western Hemisphere and continuing to practice location of countries with map games.

Science: We are wrapping up our study of the Universe. Final Exam will be Wednesday, 6/4.

Math: We are continuing our unit on Describing Data. Students learn about a second way to measure center (median) and other ways to measure spread (interquartile range and range). They create box plots to visualize data and make choices about which measures of center and spread to report based on the data. Our final assessment will be on Wednesday, June 4th.

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ELA: English students are currently working on creating a three-panel pamphlet about a hidden figure. This pamphlet includes an argumentative writing and graphic sources regarding the hidden figure’s accomplishments and the barriers they faced. Due to there being only a few work days left in school, any part of the project that is not completed during the allotted time in class will have to be completed as homework. Please note that teaching slides and other information (including due dates) are published in Google Classroom. This project will be included in the final grade and is considered a test grade. Please encourage your child to put forth their best effort and make sure that their work is done on time.

7th Grade News:

Math: Students are finishing up with some Unit 7 concepts. Next week we will spend a few days in Unit 8, Probability. Students determine the probability of unknown events and compare the results of repeated experiments and the expected probability.

Science: Mr. Huizenga’s Science Classes will be wrapping up the school year by completing our ecology unit. We will be finishing the year strong with a final assessment and some research looking into job opportunities in the field of ecology. Have a GREAT SUMMER!

8th Grade News:

ELA:
As we near the end of the year, students are finishing our class novel Farewell to Manzanar. We tracked connections and distinctions throughout the novel as well as related the happenings of that book to what we see going on in our world today.

Math 8:
The students are actively working on their Spiral project which is related to the Pythagorean theorem. There will be a short quiz on the Pythagorean Theorem on June 4.

Algebra:
In Algebra, students are working on completing the square and quadratic formula. We are working our way toward the final exam, which will be on June 4th.

U.S. History:
This week and next we will be completing a career project.

Science:
What will the earth look like in the next 1,000-2,000 years? As students learn about Climate Change, they are creating a new species from the genes of current plants or animals that can survive a warming earth. Students will be doing the last of their 13 speeches by presenting their new species and talking about the structural and behavioral characteristics that help them survive.

Electives News:

Spotlight on Arts Exploration:

6th Grade Arts Exploration - Student artists are creating a realistic flower drawing using oil pastels as their medium. This project is inspired by the artist, Georgia O’Keeffe. The students are learning how to blend pastels to create a smooth transition between colors and to achieve a realistic look.

7th Grade Arts Exploration - Student artists are developing creative lettering techniques to draw their names. Students will practice shading to create depth and dimension using colored pencils and markers. A fun brick wall will be drawn to use for the background of our name designs.

8th Grade Arts Exploration - Student artists are exploring the art of paper weaving. Students are learning about different patterns and color combinations while creating a unique design of their own. Throughout this project, students will learn about contemporary artist Julie VonDerVellen and her paper weaving techniques and sculptures.
