#### What is the Bond Election for?

On November 4, Whitehall voters will consider a <u>bond proposal</u> that would help address critical needs across Whitehall District Schools. This proposal is focused on the district's most pressing priorities, including improvements to classroom learning environments, enhanced security, and essential updates to our building infrastructure.

If approved, it is estimated that the 2026 debt millage levied would return to 5.0 mills, the same level last levied in 2024.

# <u>District Focus on Attendance -Big Sick versus Little Sick</u>

We are looking forward to a great school year, with students in classes and ready to learn every day.

Our District Attendance Target: 8 or fewer absences in a year.

Big Sick: vomit, diarrhea, fever, or sore throat. If your child has a fever of 100.0 or greater, they should be kept home until fever-free without medication for 24 hours. Your child must also be kept home until they are diarrhea/vomit-free without medication for 24 hours. Little Sick: fever 99.9 and below, and none of the above. For example, they may have a runny nose, but have no fever and are running around in the backyard.

## What are we Learning in Math?

IM 360 is all about giving students a full-circle learning experience. It's hands-on, creative, and designed to get kids thinking in new and exciting ways. Through projects, teamwork, and problem-solving, students get to make connections across subjects and see how their learning fits into the bigger picture.

Most of all, IM 360 encourages curiosity and confidence. Kids aren't just memorizing facts—they're exploring, experimenting, and discovering how to apply what they learn in real life. It's about helping them grow into creative thinkers who are ready for whatever challenges come their way.

## Spotlight on EL Ed: How We Grow Readers in K-2

At our school, we use the EL Education English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum to help students build strong speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. EL Ed is grounded in the Science of Reading and contains two essential areas of literacy: foundational skills and knowledge-building.

Skills Block - A hands-on, structured time where students build the foundational skills they need to become confident readers and writers. During whole group lessons and small group follow-up, they practice phonics, spelling, handwriting, and decoding strategies through joyful routines that help make learning stick.

Knowledge Block - A time to dive into rich, knowledge-building units centered on meaningful topics. Students build vocabulary, strengthen listening and speaking skills, and develop comprehension as they read, write, think, and talk together about big ideas.

Together, these two blocks ensure that children are not only learning how to read but also growing in what they know and understand. By weaving skills and knowledge, EL Ed helps students become curious, capable, and joyful lifelong learners.








# Constitution Day
