## THE PROGRAMS

#### GSRP

-Turn 4 before December 1 Turn 5 between September 2- December 1 -Monday-Thursday, full-day & half-day -Breakfast, lunch, snack

#### Young 5

-Turn 5 between September 2-December 1 -Little to no preK experience -Monday-Friday, 8:30-3:30 -WDS Transportation -Food Service

#### Kindergarten

-Must turn 5 on or before September 1 -Monday-Friday, 8:30-3:30 -WDS Transportation -Food Service

#### Lighthouse

-Monday-Friday, 6:30-8:30a & 3:00-6:00p -After School Snack -Transportation to and from school -Tuition-Based -No Drop-Off Care, must pre-register

## WHAT IS GSRP?

Great Start Readiness Program is a state-funded, *free* program for students who turn 4 on or before September 1st, or turn 5 between 9/2-12/1.

- Qualifying Factors
- Class Size: 16 children with 2 teachers
- When does it meet?
  - Monday-Thursday
  - WLACE & Discovery School run full-day GSRP from 8:30-3:30
  - Buttons & Bows run a half-day GSRP in the mornings
- WLACE Preschool Registration is March 26th & 27th, call our office to schedule your appointment, (231) 893-1091, on-the-spot tonight at the GSRP table



### WHAT DOES A DAY IN GSRP LOOK LIKE?

- 7 hour day, 4 days a week
- A minimum of 1 hour outdoors
- A combination of large and small group instruction
- Child-led activities
- 2 hours of free play
- 45 minutes of rest in the afternoon (children are not required to sleep)
- Breakfast, lunch and snack provided daily
- Follows the Connect 4 Learning or Montessori Curriculum

• Interdisciplinary approach across 4 domains (Math, Science, Social Emotional, and Literacy)

#### MONTESSORI GSRP

- In addition to the previous GSRP information, the WLACE Montessori classroom will:
  - -Utilize the Montessori philosophy and materials
  - -Provide an environment that calls to the developmental level of each child through hands-on, concrete before abstract lessons
  - -Provide a peaceful, respectful environment
  - -Educate the whole child to reach their full potential
  - -Provide five areas of activity: Practical Life ("CCIO") and Art, Sensorial, Math, Language, Cultural (Science and Geography)

## ELIGIBILITY FOR Y5 & K



- Must be 5 before September 1st
- Must be toilet trained
- Kids on the age waiver (birthday between 9/2-12/1) have first priority for Y5

## WHAT IS YOUNG 5's?

Mrs. Johnson & Mrs. Pate teach Young 5's which is a pre-kindergarten experience for kids who are young for their grade, have limited experience in groups, and could benefit from a year before Kindergarten

- Students must be 5 on or before December 1 . Students who turn 5 between September 2 and December 1 can attend on an age waiver.
- Class Size- 16:1 ratio
- Monday-Friday, 8:30-3:35, at Shoreline, follows WDS calendar
- WDS Transportation and Food Service
- Outcomes: mid-year K outcomes are end-of-year Y5 outcomes
- Play-based academic emphasis

## HOW ARE Y5 & K DIFFERENT?

- Y5 pace allows for more brain development time
- Purposeful Play daily allows time for discovery, small group interaction, social skills practice and teacher-supported exploration
- The teacher to student ratio is smaller in Y5
- Y5 provides a transitional year to allow additional development time around language, motor skills, social-emotional learning, and academics
- Three recesses allow for increased gross motor and social practice
- Specific SEL curriculum taught daily from the social worker
- Overall, a more hands-on approach to learning.

- Breakfast and welcome work
- Morning Meeting
- 90 Minute Literacy Block (reading, writing, listening & speaking)
- 30 Minute Intervention Block
- Lunch/Recess
- Quiet Time
- 80 Minute Math Block
- Science/Social Studies
- Specials: PE, Art, and Integrated Arts
- Purposeful Play/2nd Recess
- Closing Circle

Math: play games (Hi Ho Cherrio, Candyland, War, Uno), count the things you see, set the table



## **ENROLLMENT & REGISTRATION**

- Current Young 5 students are automatically enrolled in Kindergarten
- Current PreK students must register. It is not an automatic process.
- After you are enrolled, you will receive a letter from your child's teacher in August, welcoming them to an open house.
- All registration paperwork must be completed to confirm your child's class placement.
- The School of Choice window is open from May 1st-30th. Contact Kirsten Bolles (893-1003).

#### Whitehall District Schools 2025 Operating Millage **Quick Facts**

VOTE Tuesday, May 6, 2025

A homeowner's primary residence is exempt from this millage.

The Operational Millage brings over \$4 million into our General Fund budget: that is over 13% of the total district's budget.

Without this funding, the district would sink to one of the lowest perpupil general fund revenues in Michigan.



The Operational Millage is part of the General Fund, which is used for daily operations. This money pays for staff, utility bills, classroom supplies, busing, etc.



This is NOT A BOND proposal. This millage would not fund any school construction, renovations, or turf field projects.




If the Operational Millage Renewal does not pass, the district would need to cut over \$4 million from the budget. A 13% cut in daily expenses would likely result in reductions in almost all programs and staffing areas.
